What will the judges be looking for from the entries?

The judging panel will assess the credibility of each entry under the following guiding principles:

- Clarity of objectives
- Effective resource allocation
- Quality of implementation
- Focus on supply chain and logistics
- Innovation
- Impact on customer perception
- Evaluation criteria
- Results

If we entered a category last year, can we re-enter again for 2011?

You are welcome to submit a new application if you have entered before in previous years. However, you will need to ensure that your submission for 2011 meets the new assessment criteria and is submitted using the relevant 2011 application form.

Where can I find the award entry form?

Once you submit this information you will then be taken through to the award entry forms, which you can then download.

Can the same entry be entered into more than one category?

Entries can be submitted to more than one category providing that you can demonstrate how it meets the criterion of the different categories and supply supporting evidence required for each of the categories. An application form for each different award category to be entered for will need to be downloaded and completed.

Entries can be made with or without a partner.
